What is acupuncture all about?

Acupuncture is a 5000 year old therapeutic tradition, one of the many treatment methods applied in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM).

It involves stimulating the body's natural healing abilities to promote physical and emotional balance.

Acupuncture is based on the the-



ory that channels of electromagnetic energy circulate in regular patterns throughout the body all along the nervous system.

These energy channels, called meridians, are like rivers

flowing through the body. An obstruction in the flow of these energy rivers can lead to a variety of health issues.

Treatment consists of needling specific trigger points to reestablish the regular flow through the meridians, helping the body to correct physiological and chemical imbalances.

A widely recognized practice

Acupuncture is a registered profession in Quebec since 1995 and is fully recognized by the National Institute of Health (NIH), the U.S. authority in the field of health technology research.

Although proven to be effective, acupuncture is not miraculous. It is used on its own to treat a wide range of ailments. However, it can also be used in addition to conventional medical treatment methods to treat overly compromised systems and more acute cases. It is medically recognized in the treatment of many health problems, including digestive disorders, emotional conditions and to relieve withdrawal symptoms associated with substance use.

Acupuncture is currently used in more than 700 addiction treatment programs worldwide.

How can acupuncture help me?



It can help alleviate methadone side effects:

Constipation Insomnia Excessive Perspiration Sexual Dysfunction Apathy, etc ...

It can relieve methadone withdrawal symptoms by:

Stimulating the release of endorphins

Controlling pain and muscular spasms

Preventing/Treating diarrhea or nausea

Alleviating shakiness and sweating

Reducing cravings and agitation

Etc ...

It can help manage stress, anxiety and depression.

It has been known to relieve withdrawal symptoms associated with heroin, cocaine, alcohol, benzodiazepines, nicotine, etc...

Counter-indications:

- Medical emergencies requiring immediate assistance, in which case it is best to consult a doctor.
- Being Pregnant—the stimulation of certain points can provoke uterine contractions so it is important to inform your acupuncturist of your pregnancy.
- Homeostatic Disorders: it is proven that the stimulation of certain points can alter your blood chemistry.

Side effects ?



NONE or very few! Occasional swelling or redness can sometimes occur around needle insertion points.

Acupuncture is among the safest of medical treatment methods. Disposable needles are generally used to avoid the risk of infection. Acupuncturists are bound by standard medical safety guidelines.

What if the sight of needles makes me nauseous?



Although the needles may look painful, they rarely are. Some people report feeling minimal pain as the needles are inserted but once they are in place, there is no pain felt. Acupuncture needles are about three times the width of a hair and are designed to pierce the skin without any resistance.
